< 2 weeks before the first day of the event	85 %

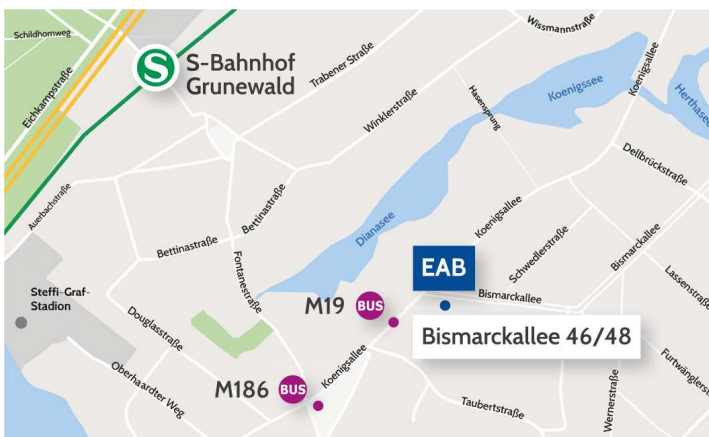
